Japanese Etiquette

Knowing how to bow in Japan might help you while you are traveling. Bowing (*ojigi*) is a very important custom in Japan. Japanese people bow all the time. Most commonly, they greet each other by bowing instead of handshaking. It is impolite not to return a bow to whoever bowed to you. Japanese people might be uncomfortable with any physical form of contact although they might be used to shaking hands with westerners. Bowing has many functions in one. It expresses the feeling of respect, thinking, apologizing, greeting, and so on. It's a convenient and important custom for you to learn.




Casual greetings only need a casual bow, so your body movement should be relaxed and you only need to bend your head slightly. How long to bow? A deeper bow is more formal and respectful than a faster bow. How deep should you bow? The general rule is the deeper the bow the more respectful. Therefore, this means that you bow lower than the other person if they are older than you or have higher seniority or social standing. Where to put your hands when bowing? For men, keep your arms to the side of your body and your hands connected to your legs. For women, the hands are slightly crossed in front of the body.

If someone bows at you, if you bow back you will do no wrong.

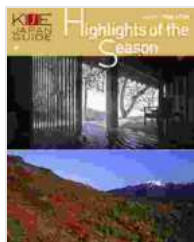
