

I was born in 1951 in Upton Park, East London. My father was a docker and my mother worked in a factory. We lived in a small terraced house with no bathroom. I shared a bed with my two brothers.

I started playing football in the streets as soon as I could walk. I was a natural and it wasn't long before I was playing for my local boys' club.

When I was 15, I was spotted by a scout from Queen's Park Rangers. I signed for the club as an apprentice and made my debut for the first team two years later.

I spent seven years at QPR, during which time I played over 200 games and scored over 50 goals. I also won two England caps.

In 1979, I moved to Manchester United for a fee of £1.5 million. I was one of the most expensive players in the country at the time.

I spent three years at United, during which time I played over 100 games and scored over 20 goals. I also won the FA Cup in 1983.

In 1984, I moved to Nottingham Forest for a fee of £1 million. I spent two years at Forest, during which time I played over 50 games and scored over 10 goals.

I retired from professional football in 1986. I had played over 400 games and scored over 100 goals in my career.

After I retired from football, I worked as a coach and a pundit. I also wrote a number of books, including my autobiography, Man and Ball.

I am now retired and live in Spain. I look back on my career with pride and gratitude. I was lucky to play the game I love for a living.




